(Thursday, April 9, 2015)

The Senate met at 3:35 p.m. pursuant to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

The President announced that a quorum of the Senate was present.

#### SENATE BILL 1255 REREFERRED (Motion In Writing)

Senator Birdwell submitted a Motion In Writing requesting that **SB 1255** be withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services and rereferred to the Committee on Intergovernmental Relations.

The Motion In Writing was read and prevailed without objection.

#### COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 10 ON THIRD READING

Senator Huffman moved to suspend the regular order of business to take up for consideration **CSSB 10** at this time on its third reading and final passage:

**CSSB 10**, Relating to the investigation and prosecution of offenses against public administration, including ethics offenses, and offenses involving insurance fraud or the imposition of the motor fuels tax.

The bill was read third time.

Senator Estes offered the following amendment to the bill:

#### Floor Amendment No. 1 on Third Reading

Amend Second Reading Amendment No. 1 by Huffman to **CSSB 10** on third reading, in SECTION 2 of the bill, in added Section 41.352, Government Code, as follows:

(1) Strike "comptroller may" and substitute "comptroller shall".

(2) Between "section" and "amounts" insert ", from appropriations made specifically for enforcement of this section, reasonable".

The amendment to CSSB 10 was read and was adopted without objection.

All Members are deemed to have voted "Yea" on the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1 on Third Reading.

On motion of Senator Huffman and by unanimous consent, the caption was again amended to conform to the body of the bill as amended.

**CSSB 10** as again amended was finally passed by the following vote: Yeas 20, Nays 11.
