REMARKS ORDERED PRINTED

On motion of Senator V. Taylor and by unanimous consent, his remarks regarding **CSSB 336** were ordered reduced to writing and printed in the *Senate Journal* as follows:

As a matter of principle, elected or appointed officers responsible for overseeing a governmental body must have unfettered access to all information within their jurisdiction. This right is essential to their oversight responsibilities.

Senate Bill 336 provides that a city councilmember, mayor, or other person that is part of a city's deliberative body have a right of access to all information within their governmental bodies.

This bill establishes a needed expectation that board members responsible for overseeing a city's functions or operation have access to all information within that governmental body.

This bill is similar in nature to a measure passed last session, House Bill 628, giving school board members the right to access information, documents, and records maintained by the school district.

The intent of SB 336 is not to waive the confidentiality of any information that would be protected from public disclosure.

Sensitive, and even proprietary information, may be classified as confidential and disclosed to the members of a city's governing body accordingly.

District board members may still access confidential information, provided they sign a confidentiality agreement when needed.

The intent of SB 336 is not to authorize elected officers to access information within political subdivisions that they do not oversee. For example, the bill does not authorize a member of the Austin City Council to access records within Travis County. Nor does the bill authorize a member of a city's parks board to access files within the police department.

The clear intent of this bill is to authorize access to information of the city governmental body that the officer oversees.

Further, the intent of Senate Bill 336 is not to infringe on the disclosure requirements under the Texas Public Information Act or otherwise affect the exemptions provided under the Act.

Rather, the intent of this Act is to clarify the legislature's expectation that district board members have unfettered access to any information within their jurisdiction.

- (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), the comptroller may release the information about a well reported under Section 74.101(e) to a claimant of mineral proceeds from the well if the claim is approved by the comptroller under Section 74.501.

- (e) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), the information compiled under Section 74.307(a)(2) is subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.
 - SECTION _____. Section 74.307, Property Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 74.307. LIST OF OWNERS; OTHER PUBLIC INFORMATION. (a) The comptroller shall compile and revise each year:
- (1) [-] except as to amounts reported in the aggregate, an alphabetical list of the names and last known addresses of the owners listed in the reports and the amount credited to each account; and
 - (2) an alphabetical list by county of:
- (A) the number of reports filed under Section 74.101 for mineral proceeds attributable to all wells located in each respective county; and
- (B) the aggregate amount of mineral proceeds reported under Section 74.101 attributable to all wells, if any, located in each respective county.
- (b) The comptroller shall make the <u>lists</u> [list] available for public inspection during all reasonable business hours.
