(Tuesday, August 10, 2021)

The Senate met at 3:49 p.m. pursuant to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Absent-excused: Menéndez, Miles.

The President announced that a quorum of the Senate was present.

Senator Powell offered the invocation as follows:

SENATE BILL 4 ON SECOND READING

Senator Lucio moved to suspend the regular order of business to take up for consideration **SB 4** at this time on its second reading:

SB 4, Relating to abortion complication reporting and the regulation of drug-induced abortion procedures, providers, and facilities; creating a criminal offense.

The motion prevailed by the following vote: Yeas 19, Nays 10.

SENATE RULES SUSPENDED (Posting Rules)

On motion of Senator Hughes and by unanimous consent, Senate Rule 11.10(a) and Senate Rule 11.18(a) were suspended in order that the Committee on State Affairs might meet today in the Betty King Committee Room, 2E.20.

The Senate met at 4:30 p.m. and was called to order by the President.

VOTE RECONSIDERED ON SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 2

On motion of Senator Bettencourt and by unanimous consent, the vote by which **SJR 2** was finally passed was reconsidered:

SJR 2, Proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for the reduction of the amount of a limitation on the total amount of ad valorem taxes that may be imposed for general elementary and secondary public school purposes on the residence homestead of a person who is elderly or disabled to reflect any statutory reduction from the preceding tax year in the maximum compressed rate of the maintenance and operations taxes imposed for those purposes on the homestead.

Question: Shall SJR 2 be finally passed?

Senator Bettencourt offered the following amendment to the resolution:

Floor Amendment No. 1 on Third Reading

Amend **SJR 2** on third reading in SECTION 2 of the joint resolution by striking "November 8" and substituting "May 7".

The amendment to SJR 2 was read and was adopted by a viva voce vote.

All Members are deemed to have voted "Yea" on the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1 on Third Reading except as follows:

SJR 2 as amended was again finally passed by the following vote: Yeas 29, Nays 0.

SENATE BILL 2 ON SECOND READING

Senator Perry moved to suspend the regular order of business to take up for consideration **SB 2** at this time on its second reading:

SB 2, Relating to requiring public school students to compete in interscholastic athletic competitions based on biological sex.

SENATE BILL 9 ON SECOND READING

On motion of Senator Huffman and by unanimous consent, the regular order of business was suspended to take up for consideration **SB 9** at this time on its second reading:

SB 9, Relating to requiring public schools to provide instruction and materials and adopt policies relating to the prevention of child abuse, family violence, and dating violence.

The bill was read second time and was passed to engrossment by a viva voce vote.

All Members are deemed to have voted "Yea" on the passage to engrossment except as follows:

Absent-excused: Menéndez, Miles.

SENATE BILL 9 ON THIRD READING

Senator Huffman moved that Senate Rule 7.18 and the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days be suspended and that **SB 9** be placed on its third reading and final passage.

The motion prevailed by the following vote: Yeas 29, Nays 0.

The bill was read third time and was passed by the following vote: Yeas 29, Nays 0. (Same as previous roll call)
